Topping the Power List

November 2013

Culture Secretary Sajid Javid was named the most powerful Asian in the UK, ahead of Nobel Peace Prize winner Malala Yousafzai and One Direction's Zayn Malik.

Mr Javid had a successful career in banking before turning to politics and rapidly rising within the ranks of the Conservative party to become the first Asian male Conservative cabinet minister. Mr Javid is the son of a Pakistan immigrant who came to the UK in 1961 with GBP1 in his pocket and worked as a bus driver.
